



Auditor Richard Holmes previously had recovered records. Ms. Hetherton further advised that it might be important at a subsequent time to show precisely what the container was.

5. Ms. Hetherton asked me and OIG Auditor Maura Nihan to go to the CVS drug store on the first floor of the building in which Hamilton's offices were located and obtain a disposable camera so that photographs of the red dumpster could be taken. Auditor Nihan and I obtained a disposable camera and returned to the Hamilton offices.

6. Ms. Hetherton requested the building manager, now known to me as Raul Ludert, to take us to the basement so that we could photograph the red dumpster. Mr. Ludert took Ms. Hetherton, Ms. Nihan and I to the basement elevator room. Ms. Hetherton took a total of twelve (12) photographs inside the basement elevator room. The photographs taken, attached hereto as Exhibits 1 through 4, were of the exterior of the red and blue dumpsters, the labels on the red dumpsters, and the basement elevator room.

7. Mr. Ludert did not say "that the totems had not been filled yesterday, like they were then, when I first showed them to the FBI agent," or words to that effect. The dumpsters were never opened to display their contents while we were in the basement elevator room taking the photographs, and there was no conversation about the contents of the dumpsters. No attempt was made to photograph any materials remaining in any of the dumpsters, plastic bags, or boxes since the purpose of taking the photographs was to show the type of container the red dumpster

was, the label on the dumpster, and the general location in which  
it was found.
